Safeguarding of children

Swavesey Squash Club is committed to creating a safe environment for children to play squash and participate in activities at the club.

Swavesey Squash Club adopts as its own the policies that England Squash sets out in its safeguarding children policy.

Specifically:

- o We recognise that all children and young people have the right to freedom from abuse.
- o We are committed to ensuring that all our coaches, officials and volunteers are carefully selected to prevent the abuse of children and young people in their care.
- o We commit to respond swiftly and appropriately to all suspicions or allegations of abuse, by providing parents and children with the opportunity to voice any concerns they may have.
- o We will ensure access to confidential information is restricted to the person responsible for children and young people or the appropriate external authorities.

We have appointed a Child Protection Officer who is responsible for children and young people, who will take specific responsibility for child safety, and who will act as the main point of contact for parents, children and outside agencies.
